Will Rogers Memorial Center Parking Rates Legend

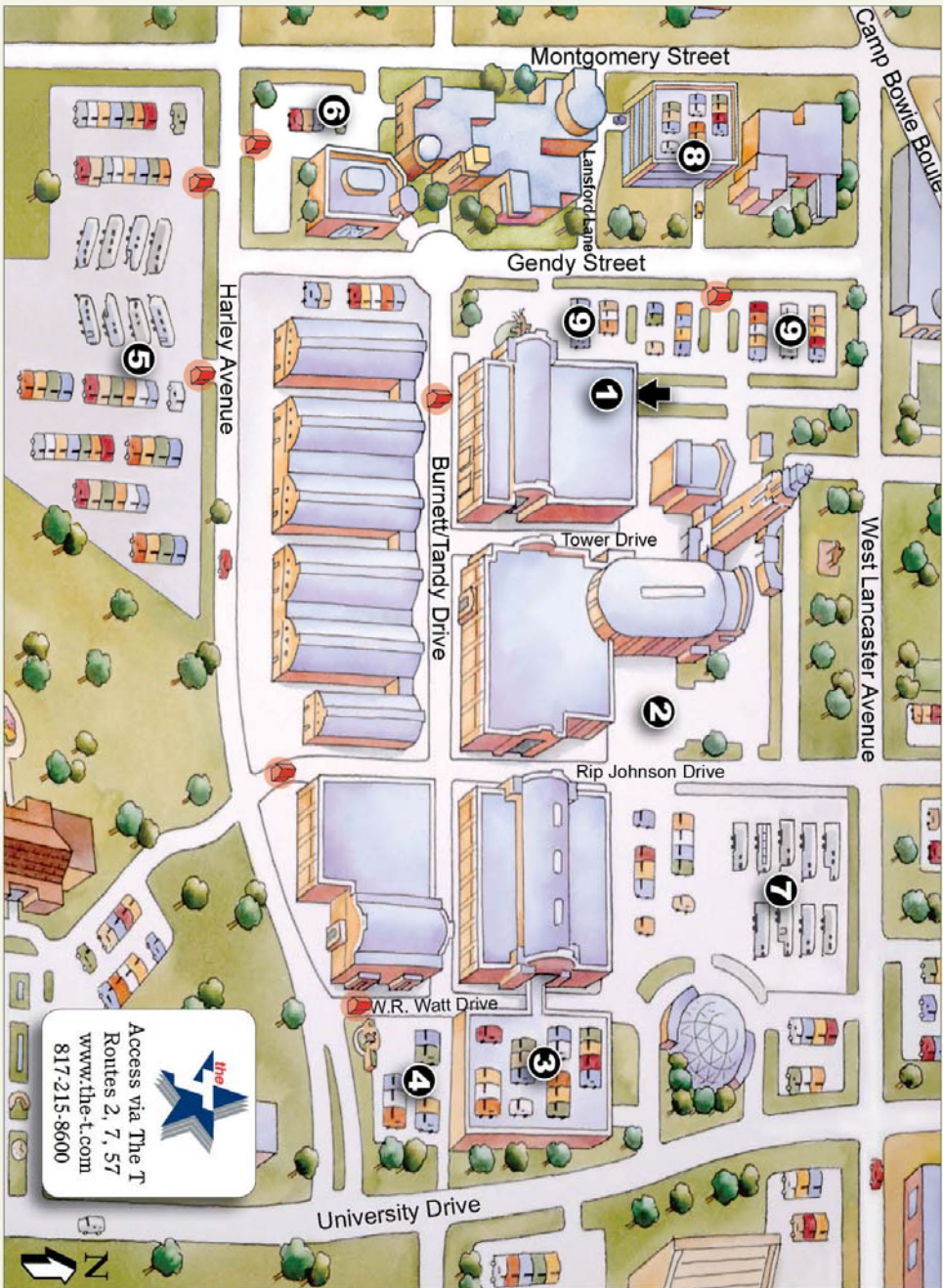

Western Heritage Parking Garage

Artist Mike Mandel may hail from the Boston area, but that hasn't stopped him from capturing the spirit of Fort Worth's frontier roots in a new Fort Worth Public Art installation at the Western Heritage Parking Garage.

The garage is bordered by the new Museum of Science and History and the Fort Worth Community Arts Center.

Mandel selected iconic images of individuals and events that capture the spirit of Fort Worth's heritage. The installation includes four spectacularly scaled, 33-foot-by-9-foot glass and porcelain tile mosaic murals on the exterior of the garage, in insets adjacent to the corner towers of the multilevel structure.

Fort Worth Public Art is a city-sponsored program whose goals are to create an enhanced visual environment for Fort Worth residents while commemorating the City's rich cultural and ethnic diversity. The Arts Council of Fort Worth and Tarrant County manages the program which integrates art into the development of the City's capital infrastructure improvements and promotes tourism and economic vitality through artistic design of public spaces.
